March Madness

God has routine divine appointments for disciples of Jesus. First he invites everyone to spend time with him. I assure you; He has you on his calendar. Sadly, many miss their appointments. I encourage you to check in with God and see what time and dates he has listed so you can put it on your calendar. Please, sit quietly before him with your calendar. Ask, "Lord, I want to spend more time (regular time) with you. When do you think it would be a good time for me to put that into my schedule?" Thoughts will come to mind. Write them in your calendar. Keep your appointment. Some times you will have spiritual mountaintop appointments. Other times not much seems to happen. When that's the case content yourself with this fact- you showed up, and God is delighted with the effort.

The second type of divine appointment God has for disciples involves other people. When you spend time with God, reflect on what you have received. Thank God for what you have received. This could be an encouraging word from a friend, a well cooked meal from a loved one, or an insight from God through his word, or a calm disposition in a troubling situation. This list is endless. Now, having brought to mind and thanked God for what you have received, you are in a position to share what you have received. God will arrange for your path to cross with others – via an email, a phone call, in person, a text message. In such divine appointments you will have something to share from what you've received – joy, encouragement, thankfulness, insight, wisdom, something material, etc.

"But how will I know when I am having a divine appointment?" some will ask, greatly concerned to 'get it right.' Does it really matter if you recognize in the moment that you are having a divine appointment? It does not. Isn't it more important to just spend your life being present to those around you and available to the Lord throughout your day? It is. There will be occasions when it is plainly obvious God has given you a divine appointment with someone. Enjoy. Most of the time you will only realize you just had a divine appointment once it has come and gone. And for those interested in being available for divine appointments, many will occur and go completely unnoticed by you. But not by God. He smiles when a plan comes together.

May your March be a time of mad availability to the Lord. He has scheduled appointments for you.

MEALS FROM THE HEARTLAND IS COMING BACK TO AUDUBON!

You are invited to a regional mobile Meals from the Heartland food packing event this coming March 25, 2023 held at the Audubon Recreation Center. This is a win-win gathering of children, youth, adults, and families, to help fight hunger here in Iowa, in the U.S. and throughout the world. We will have the opportunity to work together, bringing teams of up to 10 people of any age grouping to pack for 60-minute shifts, or come to help as an army of one joining with others fighting hunger as a team.

Thousands of people have helped to fight hunger each year during mobile hunger fights and at the signature event, the Annual Hunger Fight, held each fall in Des Moines, at Hy-Vee Hall. Over 26,035,992 meals were packed in 2022, 4 million of these packed at the Annual Hunger Fight. Each nutritious meal contains rice, textured soy protein, dried vegetable and vitamins and accepted by most cultures throughout the world. Meals from the Heartland mission partners include the Des Moines Area Religious Council, the Food Bank of Iowa, Convoy of Hope based in Missouri and Blessman Ministries in South Africa. In 2020 alone, 1,674,000 meals were distributed across the state of Iowa.

Our goal is to raise a minimum of \$7,500. The more monies raised, the greater the number of volunteer hunger fighters that will be able to participate. Businesses, individual businessmen and women, church groups, interested individuals, are all invited to consider offering a tax-deductible donation. You may pass along a monetary gift to any of the sponsoring groups, who will then pass them along to Meals from the Heartland for this 2023 food packing event. Additional sponsoring groups are welcome to join with us in this important local, national, and international mission. - The new Bunn coffee pot has been installed in the downstairs dishwasher room.

- OSLC Council is in the process of purchasing a mini bus with wheel chair lift. This is a mission project purchased with the Mission Outreach Fund monies. The van will be donated to the Friendship Home. They will use it to transport residents to community events, church worship services, Etc.

This is a program through Congregate Meals, located in the Audubon Memorial Building. Meals are delivered Monday – Friday to individuals who are homebound or in need of a prepared noon meal. Teams of two volunteers are needed for each day, consisting of a driver and a person to take the meal into homes. Meet at Memorial Building at 10:30 a.m. and report to kitchen staff. Delivery of meals takes 45 minutes to 1 hour.
