Who said this? Well, it was non-other than the Apostle Paul's exclamation (2 Cor. 9:15) upon hearing the Corinthian church's response to the preaching of the Good News of Jesus the Christ, and his request for support for the church in Jerusalem. The Christians in Corinth heard and then received God's mercy through the Messiah, and they responded to Paul's call to support Christians in Jerusalem with an offering. The Corinthians' joyful giving filled Jerusalem's need. This is the reality of stewardship.

Because of God's generosity in the giving of His Son to die on the cross for us, we are called to be generous with all that we receive from Him. What do we receive? Everything! All that we are, and all that we have, is the Lord's. He is the Creator and the Giver of all life. We are His created and those who receive what He gives. It sounds easy doesn't it. And it is!! But then again it isn't...

Stewardship is easy because it is God's work. Through what God gives, we are called to give to His Church and others. Through what God gives, we support the work of the Church, for the local community as well as the regional and international Christian community. He gives... we receive... we give. And like our generous Father in Heaven, we, as Our Saviour's children, use what He gives to us to love and serve others. ALL IN HIS NAME!!!

But stewardship is also challenging. That is because, for some of us, it goes against our natural inclination to think that what I have is mine (*time*, *talents*, *treasures*) to do what I want with. This is often referred to as: our sinful nature that involves selfishness and greed. How can we, who have been given everything: life, food, clothing, shelter, home, forgiveness, the blessing of being Children of our Saviour, an eternal inheritance — sometimes be a bit tight with our *time and talents*? For if God has given us His Son, will He not give us all the things we need? Yes. He will!!

Theologically, Martin Luther shared that God provides everything we need for this body, this life, and for the life that is to come. Can I hear an AMEN! And what is a joyful thing to do? Hebrews 12:1-2 shares: "Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God." Thanks be to God for His indescribable gifts that we personally enjoy and corporately are blessed with through being Saints In Service at Our Saviour's Lutheran.
