Happy with... you fill in the ______! Were you aware that the Bible uses the words *happy* and *happiness* about 30 times?

So, what then is *joy*? God definitely calls us to be joyful people! A definition of the word *rejoice*, related to the word *joy*, is "to feel great delight; to be glad." Were you aware that the Bible uses the words *joy* and *rejoice* about 300 times?

In the Bible, joy is a state of being that is more of a choice than an emotion, while happiness is more of an emotion that is based on circumstances. As a follower of Jesus the Christ I have chosen JOY!



Checkout this great Bible passage from the New Testament Book of James: "Consider it all joy, my brothers, when you encounter various trials."

You may be going through tough times, trials, that no one else is aware of... except God. And yet, He still calls you to be joyful! Here is a great quote from Oswald Chambers: Living a full and overflowing life does not rest in bodily health, in circumstances, nor even in seeing God's work succeed, but in the perfect understanding of God, and in the same fellowship and oneness with Him that Jesus Himself enjoyed. But the first thing that will hinder this joy is the subtle irritability caused by giving too much thought to our circumstances.


