The Sermon on CHANGE struck a chord with many at Our Saviour's!

Churches / People are always changing. Only the dead ones don't!

Many of you have belonged to OSLC for many, many years! You may have been attracted to Our Saviour's because of location, because you liked the pastor, or a relative went here before you. You have served the Lord here in numerous capacities and your children grew up here and now maybe your grandchildren. You have a history here. And now.... Well, now, it's not the same church that it was 20, 10, 5, 1 year ago! There's a different pastor and new leadership and another pastor coming soon, we pray.

What should you do with CHANGE?

- **1. Recognize that OSLC is always in a state of change as we remain faithful.** Every time someone walks in the door or departs, the church can change. Every time you or another saint gets serious about reading the Word or witnessing or tithing or ministering to others, the Body of Christ changes. It is never static, never frozen (although it seemed close last month at minus 15!).
- 2. Perhaps you are dragging your feet and resisting something new the Holy Spirit is trying to do in your life. You may reject the new things He sends because they are outside your comfort zone. Do you suppose Jonah felt comfortable going to Nineveh? Don't you know it was way, way outside his comfort zone?
- **3.** Are you open to new things? New ways? If so, you are growing and changing right now! If you are not, you're going to have trouble with the Lord Jesus. "Behold," the Lord said, "I make all things new" (*Revelation 21:5*). He wasn't just talking about Heaven. He's making me / you ever-new right now. Just read Psalm 92:12-15 to see what I mean!

So, what do you do when OSLC seems to be changing? You grow / go with it!
