Change happens in many ways.... And as you can see from the photos change has happened in the "Sacristy" through renovation (I'm told for the first time since the building was constructed in 1950) by Kurt Nelsen & Nate Vorm. OSLC is blessed that the Women Of the Word and Memorial monies paid for the entire project. The Worship Committee is working to get everything in its proper place for long-term best use practices. But what is a "Sacristy"?

First, what do we call the room in the Sanctuary, near the Altar area? The room... is called the "Sacristy". The use of sacristies became common over 1500 years ago. In most churches the Sacristy is beside or behind the Altar area (often called the Chancel). At OSLC, it is located to the right of the Chancel.

So, what's it used for? The Sacristy is the storage place for the blessed items used in God's house. For example, the new communion ware used for Holy Communion is stored there, as well as candles, oil, and all the church paraments (tapestry hangings used to decorate the Chancel area). The other awesome use is when the Altar Guild volunteers prepare the elements of Holy Communion on the first and third Sundays of each month. This special space also stores the items needed for worship services such as: Ash Wednesday, Holy Week, Pentecost, Reformation and so much more! Go ahead and step into this refreshed space and even pray about becoming part of the Worship Committee ministries.
