"Stepping Lightly"

I didn't expect to share in a therapy session this week. I thought I was stopping in for a visit, a word of encouragement, a prayer. Instead, I was welcomed into the work of healing — a holy moment disguised in ordinary time.

I went to visit a friend at the hospital but her therapist was already present, guiding her carefully. They both laughed and welcomed me, as I watched my friend move her legs, sometimes painfully. At first, I felt like an intruder. But then something small, almost unnoticed, shifted. I saw her bag sitting on a nearby table, just out of reach. She has led countless Bible studies in her life and I began to wonder if her Bible was inside. She has opened God's Word for others again and again, shaping faith and our community. But in today's moment, this mighty leader who has drawn so many closer into God's word could not reach it herself.

So I did the simplest thing. I asked her permission to move the Bible closer, and she agreed. The psalmist's "lamp" was placed within reach again.

Isn't this how Christ often meets us? Not always in the expected places, but in the unexpected ones. Not only in the sanctuary, but in a hospital room. Not always when we are leading strong, but when we are weary and must let others lead us into His therapy.

Mark 2:1-5 came to mind as the moment reminded me: we are all leaders in one season, and learners in another. Sometimes we carry others to the Word; sometimes we must be carried. Sometimes we speak; sometimes we simply hold the "lamp" near enough for someone to see Jesus, and their life, in His light.

Jesus Himself often appeared unexpectedly: at a roadside meal, in a crowded house, in the middle of a storm. His Word was light, and wherever it was drawn close to those in darkness, hearts and minds were opened.

May you be ready for God's next 'holy interruption." May you move God's Word closer, whether in a study hall or a hospital, whether in joy or in weakness. And may we trust, as Isaiah did, that the Word of God shall go forth, and never return empty. God will give you the opportunity to carry it to someone in need.

August's sermon series: Resting in God.




Aug 17th: Callahan Renken (son of Andrew & Ellen Renken) was baptized in the name of the Holy Trinity
